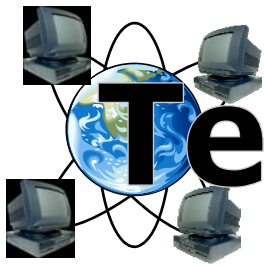

L230 Labor and the Economy

We have learned some tough lessons over the past year about how our economy does not work when left to the wealthy entrepreneurs and bankers to make decisions. We have seen unprecedented wealth in a few hands, with tragic losses of housing, lifetime savings, and pensions for workers. In this class we will discuss how and why the financial crisis happened and which political and economic policies facilitated the restructuring of financial markets to create such gross inequality. We will examine the myths and realities of a market economy, and analyze, in particular, how privatization, outsourcing and deregulation worked together to redistribute wealth upwards. We will explore alternatives, what an economy might look like if it were built to secure housing, income and health care for all. Dreaming another possible economic world is the first step toward moving to build one. The L230 Labor & the Economy can also be audited as if non-credit for \$100. 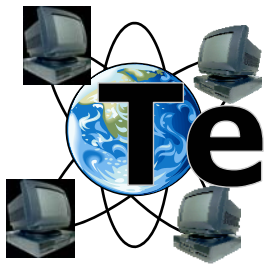

The Microsoft Certified Desktop Support Technician (MCDST) credential establishes you as a professional with the skills to educate users, as well as solve hardware or software operation and application problems on the desktop or client side based on the Windows XP desktop operating system and the Microsoft office system. Windows XP will be the primary operating system for most business computers for many years to come and this is the premiere certification for XP based systems. Completing this certification also establishes you as a Microsoft Certified Professional "MCP". You will receive a free trial copy of Windows XP professional and will need access to a computer for installing the XP operating system. In the future, you will be able to upgrade your MCDST certification to the latest version by completing a single upgrade certification class in Windows Vista or Windows 7. What is Telecasting?

In a Telecasting course, you are in a class that meets at Burns Harbor and Leon Lynch at the same time. You can choose the site that is most convenient for you to attend. This class is live and is broadcast to other sites. Everyone can talk to the teacher and visa versa. After 24 hours the class is uploaded to the internet. Those classes can then be **streamed**. That means that you can watch it as a review or just watch it because you were not able to be there in person. Some students may **STREAM** all the sessions. That's the beauty of TELECASTING. Taking and completing a course will never be easier. If space is available, any class with a diamond (◆) next to the title is a class that **Local 1010 & 1011** Spouses and Retirees are eligible to take. Classes **without** a (◆) next to it are for active steelworkers only!

◆ *Classes that are billed as **flat rate** will have some variances in prices depending on the total number registered. Once registration ends, a final dollar amount is determined. Quoted prices do not include book costs. Books can be purchased directly from Amazon or through the instructor.*
